

KIZILAYKART CASH BASED ASSISTANCE PROGRAMMES

April 2019

Kızılaykart is a platform where humanitarian, private, and public sectors come together. It provides regular cash support via banking infrastructure to the needy people that meet the specified criteria. Initially Kızılaykart was implemented for Turkish citizens in 2011. Due to the internal conflict in Syria, emergency food assistance support was implemented to Syrians who had to left their country in March 2011. After that, the Kızılaykart project, which was launched in 2012 with the In Camp Food Assistance Programme to meet the basic needs of the vulnerable people, is a platform that hosts nine programs on different themes as of 2019.

Different programs can be applied and separate wallets can be defined according to different conditions and payment regulations to strengthen the needy and bring social harmony. With the expertise of Türk Kızılay in information management, various programs for different target groups in different categories can be implemented with different donors and stakeholders under the roof of Kızılaykart. Within the current structure of the Kızılaykart Platform; basic needs, education, livelihood, and protection-based humanitarian programs are implemented.

In Camp Programme

In Camp Food Assistance Programme is implemented for foreigners living in six different temporary accommodation centers, with the partnership of Türk Kızılay, GIGM, and WFP. The beneficiaries receive \$9 per person each month (ecoupon) which they can spend on contracted markets located inside the camps.

The program, which has been implemented since 2012, aims to ensure that individuals can access the food they prefer through freedom of choice. The program is funded by; EU, Turkey, Australia, Denmark, France, Germany, Japan, Kuwait, South Korea, Mexico, Norway, and USA.

Emergency Social Safety Net Programme (ESSN)

ESSN is the largest Cash Based Assistance Program in the world in terms of a number of beneficiaries, regularity, and long term assistance planning. It has been planned to ensure that the vulnerable meet their basic needs such as food, shelter, and clothing in an honorable way. The program is implemented in cooperation with Türk Kızılay, Ministry of Family, Labor and Social Services (MoFLSS), and UN World Food Program (WFP). It is funded by the European Union Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid (ECHO) and supported by the General Directorate of Population and Citizenship Affairs (NVI) and General Directorate of Migration Management (DGMM).

The cash provided within the scope of the program is carried out by monthly payment of \$22 per person. In addition to regular assistance, additional payments are also made to severely disabled and dependent individuals.






Total Payment



Conditional Cash Transfer for Education Programme (CCTE)

The coverage of the Conditional Cash Transfer for Education (CCTE) Programme which was implemented for children who are Turkish nationals on 2003, was extended by the year 2017 to the foreign children with the funds of ECHO, Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration Office (BPRM) of US, and the Government of Norway.

CCTE Programme is being implemented with the partnership of; Türk Kızılay, Ministry of National Education (MoNE), MoFLSS and UNICEF. It was aimed to ensure that children have access to school and attend classes regularly with the cash assistance offered under the program. The cash assistance amounts vary according to gender and school levels between \$6 to \$11 for each month. The payments are made on a bi-monthly basis and the program proposes to interrupt the assistance if the children are absent at school for more than 4 days in a month.

The protection procedures of beneficiary children within the scope of the CCTE Program are carried out by Türk Kızılay Community Based Migration Programs. There are specific child protection offices across Turkey. Within the scope of the program, identifying children who are absent, determining the risks in the scope of protection and monitoring are carried out with precision.

Accelerated Learning Program (ALP): There are 1.324 students who attend the Accelerated Learning Program for children who are in the age group of 10-18 and who have not attended school for more than three years.

Supporting Survivors of Human Trafficking in Turkey

In order to ensure that post-traumatic effects can be eased through the program implemented in partnership with the Red Crescent Programs and Community Center Programs as of November 2018, psycho-social support, housing in Safe Houses operating under DGMM and regular cash assistance is provided to victims of human trafficking.

Within the scope of the "Strengthening of the National Referral Mechanism for Migrants in a Vulnerable Situation" project, implemented with the organisation providing funding for the programme, UN International Organization for Migration (IOM), a monthly payment of \$90 and \$36 for children under the age of 18 made in certain cities in Turkey to foreign national victims of human trafficking living in Safe Houses.


Adult Language Training Programme (ALT)

As a result of researches for target groups conducted within the scope of Kızılaykart, it has been detected that the biggest obstacle for foreigners' employment and social cohesion is the language barrier. Within this framework, Adult Language Training for Syrians under Temporary Protection in Turkey programme is being implemented with the Ministry of National Education (MoNE) and the UN Development Programme (UNDP).

Foreigners who are going to participate in t he A dult Language Training Programme, which is being implemented in 10 provinces, are provided with cash support through Kızılaykart in consideration of their participation. Trainees are paid \$1 per hour for their participation in the training (three hours a day, three days a week). The program is funded by resources provided by the EU Trust Fund (EUTF) for Intervention in the Syrian Crisis. The target audience is 52,000 people.

Vocational Course Incentive (VCI)

The Vocational Course Incentive is conducted wi thin the scope of the Livelihood Development project that started to be implemented in April 2019 with Community Centers (CC). Participants are given incentive payments in li ne wi th their vocational training. Attendee payments for the first semester were made in April 2019.

The financial source of the Course Allowance Support Program is provided by the MADAD fund. As of May 2019 Basic Agriculture and Livestock, Wood Skeleton Mounting, Seedling-Sapling Breeding, Gardening - Greenhouse and Cook Apprentice Courses are being organized within the scope of the Programme.

Vocational Course Allowance (VCA)

The Daily Allowance Support Project is one of the livelihood development projects that Kızılaykart is jointly implementing with the Community Based Migration Programs (CBM). The project started as of April 2019 and the first payments to the participants have been completed. Individuals from all nationalities with A1 level knowledge of Turkish language that fall in the age range of 18-60 are able to participate in the project. Within the scope of the project, trainees are paid monthly for each day based on their course attending.

The courses provided under the Daily Allowance Support Project are judicial assistant training, mushroom cultivation, and greenhouse vegetable cultivation. The project is im plemented through Community Centers which is funded by the German Red Cross.

Culinary Training Project (Hope in the Kitchen)

The "Kitchen of Hope" is a livelihood development project jointly implemented under the partnership of two of important TRC programmes namely Kızılaykart Cash Based Assistance Programmes and Community Based Migration Programmes. Within the scope of the project, which started to be implemented as of May 2019, the allowance of each individual participating in the cookery course is made through Kızılaykart.

The courses are held in Ankara and Istanbul and attended by Syrian nationals. It is foreseen that 50% of selected participants for the project are women and 50% of them are ESSN beneficiaries. Within the scope of the project, a monthly payment of \$180 is given to participants through Kızılaykart.

The project is funded by the UN World Food Programme (WFP) and is expected to continue until September 2019.
