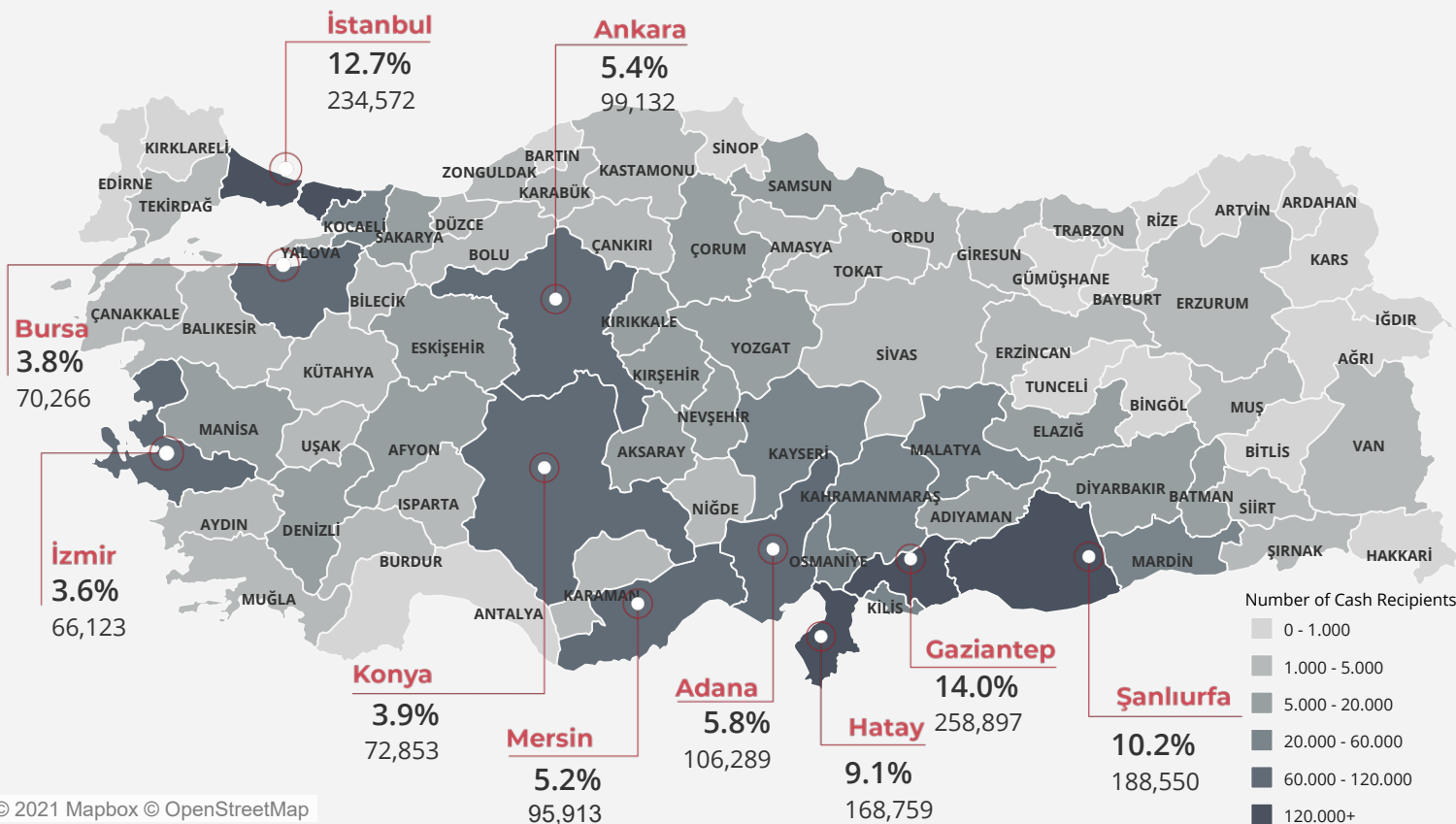

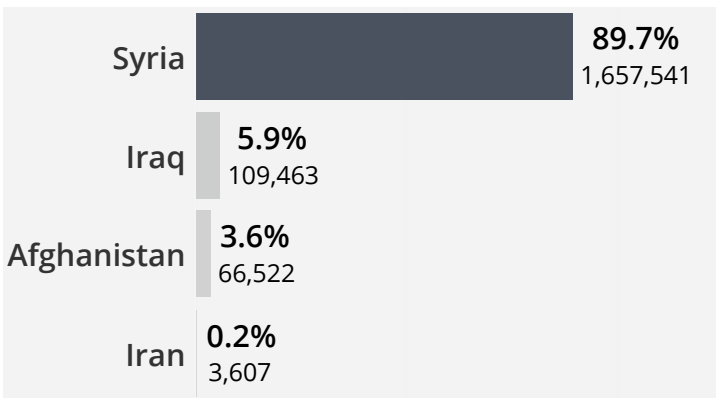


Top Ten Provinces with Highest Number of People Receiving Regular Assistance

May 2021



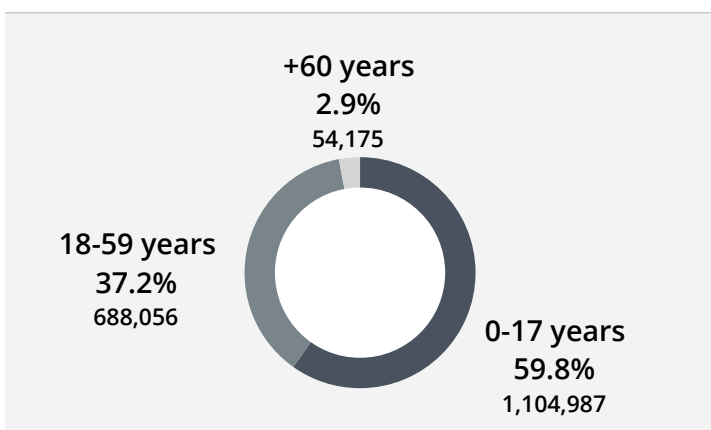
Nationality Breakdown (Top 4 Nationalities)



Criteria Breakdown

Families with four or more children.	55.2%	1,020,483
Families that have a high number of 'dependents'. This is determined as families that have at least 1.5 dependents for every able bodied adult.	23.5%	435,013
Families with one or more disabled people. They must have a disability of 40% or more.	9.3%	171,341
Single parents with no other adults in the family and at least one child under 18.	8.6%	158,883
Elderly people above 60 with no other adults in the family.	0.8%	14,109
Single female.	0.6%	11,399
